


Proposition 2020-14 Continuation and Extension of Sales and Use Tax for Transportation Improvements

The City Council of the City of Bellingham, Washington, exercising the assumed powers of Transportation Benefit District No. 1, adopted Resolution No. 2020-23 concerning a sales and use tax to finance transportation improvements. This proposition would authorize the continuation and extension of an existing sales and use tax of two-tenths of one percent (0.002) on all taxable retail sales within the city in accordance with RCW 82.14.0455 for a ten-year period to pay or finance costs of the following transportation improvements contained in the City's Transportation Improvement Program: Annual Street Pavement Resurfacing Program; Nonmotorized Transportation Improvements; and Climate Action Plan & Whatcom Transportation Authority ("WTA") Transit Plan improvements.
