Fire Protection District No. 4 Whatcom County, Washington Proposition No. 1 Authorizing Real Property Tax Levy	
The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 4, Whatcom County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2012-1 authorizing a regular property tax levy of \$1.26 per \$1,000. This proposition would authorize the District to set its regular property tax levy at \$1.26 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for 2012 and thereafter subject to any otherwise applicable statutory dollar rate limitations. The dollar amount of this levy would be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for subsequent levies under RCW 84.55.050. Should this proposal be approved?

<b>Election of Political Party Precinct Committee Officer - Partisan Office</b>	
"For this office only: In order to vote for precinct committee officer, a partisan office, you must affirm that you are a Democrat or a Republican and may vote only for one candidate from the party you select. Your vote for a candidate affirms your affiliation with the same party as the candidate. This preference is private and will not be matched to your name or shared."

**To Vote:** Use either blue or black ink. Do not use a felt tip pen or pencil. Connect the Head and Tail of the arrow that points to your choice with a **Single Line as shown.** ←——→

**To Correct A Mistake:** Draw a line through the incorrect choice like this: ~~John Doe~~  
You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.

**Write-In:** To vote for a person not on the ballot, connect the arrow and write in the name of the person on the line provided.

In any race you choose to vote, vote for only one candidate.

Not all districts or measures on this sample will appear on your ballot. Only the district that you're entitled to vote on will appear.

Beginning this year the only Precinct Committee Officer contests that will appear on the ballot are where there are two or more candidates of the same party running in a precinct.
